## Waivers made simple

Medicaid waiver programs help provide options, not covered by Medicaid alone, for individuals with disabilities to live in their home or community rather than in an institution. Waivers can support the health and safety needs of individuals with disabilities or complex medical needs. Waivers are not an entitlement, and each waiver has specific eligibility requirements. United States citizens or legal permanent residents are eligible for a waiver.

### Steps to success

- 1. Receive certification of disability. Depending on the type of waiver, disability certifications may come through Social Security, State Medical Review Team, or your doctor.
- 2. Apply for Medical Assistance (MA) Disability through your county or online: <a href="http://www.dhs.state.mn.us/mnchoices">http://www.dhs.state.mn.us/mnchoices</a>
- 3. Once approved for MA Disability, schedule a MN Choice Assessment online or through your county.
- 4. A MN Choice Assessor will come to your home to evaluate whether your child qualifies for services. Your child must be assessed annually to ensure they still qualify.
- 5. You will receive a written assessment summary from the county and will be assigned a contact person to review and develop a community support plan.
